The Problem

Most facility protection programs are limited in their ability to prevent and mitigate threats. They are reactive in nature & exhibit areas of weakness:

- Lack of comprehension of Design Base Threat (DBT) needed to guide & direct security operations
- Passive mind set that emphasizes reactive instead of proactive measures
- Ineffectiveness of security & general staff because of poor training
- Limited counter surveillance measures & training

Procedures for incident response are also absent. Inadequacies in planning & training lead to facility security & safety personnel unfamiliar with incident response best practices. Deficiencies include:

- Limited threat recognition
- Insufficient primary & alternate communications, lack of command, and control
- Lack of critical decision making process
- Poor training & ineffective drills
